Grace's record of service to her department of World Languages and Literatures, to the college, and to the larger community is outstanding, and difficult to summarize in a singular citation.

Over a 34-year career, Grace has consistently answered "Yes" when asked if willing to serve. Within her department, she has served as Coordinator for the Spanish Language Section, a large division within World Languages and Literatures. Grace's service has also included membership on the departmental Curriculum Committee and on numerous search committees.

Outside her department, Grace has answered the bell seemingly at every level and throughout the college. She served as Dean of Studies (now Associate Dean of the Faculty for Student Academic Affairs) where she was often the public face of the college to countless students and parents. Grace has chaired the Committee on Appointments, Promotion and Tenure, the Tenure Review Board, the Institutional Planning Committee (now IPPC), as well as the Committee on Academic Freedom and Rights-- this last one for four years!
